January 2023-brief overview presented by Ed Powers; Dues & Subscriptions includes 5 Year Go Daddy renewal. Question presented regarding Membership Dues still short about \$4K. Melissa said people forget to pay their dues but usually remember during elections or the conference. Mike noted a formula discrepancy on the estimated column of Budget-to-Date-revenues and expenses are added together. Ed will correct the formula. Discussed insurance, including coverage for Roadeo.

#### **PRESENTATIONS:**

#### 1. Legislative Update – J.D. Bullington

JD had a positive conversation with Secretary of the Department of Transportation Ricky Serna. In the past, Secretary Sandoval had designated \$600,000 each budget cycle for transit projects brought forward by NMTA. JD asked if he still had those discretionary funds, Secretary Serna said he does and that with a current balance of \$10 million in the fund, \$600,000 seems reasonable; he wants to continue the discussion after the legislative session.

Yield to Buses bill (SB 249), sponsored by Senator Bobby Gonzalez, has not been scheduled for its first hearing because the committee its in-the Senate Tax, Business & Transportation Committee-is moving very slowly, taking bills in order.

Creation of NM Transit Permanent Fund (SB 55) had a superb first hearing in committee. The Senate Majority Forum Leader, Peter Worth, gave it a strong thumbs up. Now it is in the Senate Finance Committee where Senator Campos (the bill's sponsor) is a member. JD feels cautiously optimistic about the forward movement of this bill; it is doing much better than when it started in the house.

#### 1. 2023 Board Elections Update

Melissa is taking nominations for this year's elections through 2/17/2023. The ballot will be valid through 3/15/2023. Existing board members have been nominated and all have accepted. #### 2. 2023 NM Transit Managers' Leadership Conference, Road-eo, Conference and Expo

Melissa stated the plans for the conference and Road-eo are moving along well. March 10<sup>th</sup>, 7:30AM to 12;00PM, will be setup and measurements; the course will be marked out on the floor with permanent marker. Getting cones ready, probably need 30-50 cones (maybe less). We still need large buses for the Road-eo. ABQ Ride trying to get approval, and Melissa trying to reach out to Santa Fe Trails. Still waiting for NMDOT to approve the sessions schedule. Waiting to hear from Deborah Bach. Lot reserved for Creative Bus Sales Bus Expo. On Saturday, there will be the driver prep and a separate managers' leadership conference at Santa Ana Star. The keynote speaker for this year's conference is Andy Masters-being positive in a stressful work environment. Five to six vendors signed up so far for the Expo.







#### Who We Are

The New Mexico Transit Association - a non-profit corporation established in 1987 - represents public transportation providers, transit sector industries, and various non-profit organizations concerned about public transportation issues. NMTA is the most prominent and vocal advocate for all issues related to public transportation in New Mexico. NMTA provides a variety of vital services for its members, and acts as the collective voice of the public transportation sector.

#### The Public Transportation Situation in New Mexico

New Mexico is a state on the move. There are dozens of public transportation programs in our State providing over 18.5 million passenger trips per year. They provide a variety of essential multimodal services to the public, seniors, disabled individuals, low-income, students, and those without access to a personal vehicle or for those who choose not to own a personal vehicle.

These services provide demand response, fixed route, shuttle, park & ride, commuter, rideshare, and specialized services to New Mexico residents.

Currently, the majority of these services are funded through the sole participation of local governments who provide local match funding to access available funding from the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). The New Mexico Department of Transportation – Transit and Rail Division administers the federal transit funding that New Mexico receives from FTA.

Twenty-six out of thirty-three counties have some form of public transportation. There are urban transportation systems that operate in Albuquerque, Los Lunas, Santa Fe, Farmington, and Las Cruces. The remaining services provide rural public transportation and enhanced mobility to seniors and individuals with disabilities.
