He joined the City of Las Cruces in 2010 as a Bus Operator. He was promoted to Route Supervisor in 2014, followed by a quick advancement to Transit Manager in 2015. He also served as the Interim Fleet Administrator for several months before returning to the Transit department.

His efforts played a key role in securing a significant grant from the U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Transit Administration, enabling the Roadrunner Transit to acquire five electric buses for its fleet in 2024, and six electric buses in 2025. Richard succeeds Michael Bartholomew who retired March 31, 2025, after serving over 23 years as the director of Roadrunner Transit.
